

I Magnify My Calling As a Ward Cub Scout Adult Leader

Registered:

- I am registered as an Adult Cub Scout Leader.
- (Committee Chair) I see that new Cub Scouts and Cub Scout Leaders are registered immediately.
- (Committee Chair) I see that the Cub Pack is rechartered on time annually.

Uniform:

- I have a Cub Scout Leader uniform with the proper patches and tabs.
- I wear my Cub Scout Leader uniform at all Cub Scout meetings and events to set the example for the Cub Scouts.

Leader Materials:

- I have a *Cub Scout Leader Book*.
- I have a *Cub Scout Program Helps*.
- (Den Leaders) I have the *Cub Scout Handbook* (Wolf, Bear, Webelos) for the den with which I am working.
- (Webelos Leader) I have the *Webelos Leader Handbook*.

Meetings:

- I attend monthly Cub Scout Leader Roundtable.
- I attend monthly Cub Scout Pack Coordination meeting.
- (Cubmaster, Committee Chair, Primary Counselor responsible for Cub Scouts) I attend the monthly Ward Key Scout Leader Coordination Meeting.
- (Den Leaders) I am prepared for and attend weekly Den Meetings.
- I am prepared for and attend monthly Pack Meetings.
- (Primary Counselor responsible for Cub Scouts) I meet with the parents of boys who turn 8 years old to tell them about Cub Scouts, answer their questions on Cub Scouting, and get a completed Cub Scout Registration form. I take the Wolf Den Leader with me.
- (Cub Pack Trainer) I meet with Den Leaders to help them get started and occasionally visit their Den Meetings to help them improve.

Training:

- I have viewed Cub Scout Leader *Fast Start* either online or on video tape/DVD.

- I have taken Youth Protection Training either online or at a Scout District training course.
- I have taken the New Leader Essentials course (1½ hours from the Scout District).
- I have taken the Cub Scout Leader Specific course for my Cub Scout position (3 hours from the Scout District).
- I attend the annual Cub Scout Leader Pow Wow to get more ideas and training.
- I attend University of Scouting to get more training.
- (Committee Chair) I get adult leaders to training and see to it that the Pack Trainer helps new leaders get started and check on their progress.

Program:

- I help my Pack qualify for the Summer-Time Pack Award by helping my pack to have three summer pack activities and help my Cub Scouts go to Day Camp.
- (Cubmaster) I conduct theme oriented Pack Meetings using the Program Helps and other resources. The pack meeting includes opening and closing ceremonies, skits, demonstrations, games, songs, meeting sparkers, award presentations and a Cub Master's Minute.
- (Committee Chair) I see that Cub Scouts are registered for and attend Cub Scout Day Camp. I see that adequate adult leaders and transportation is arranged for Day Camp.
- (Committee Chair, Webelos Den Leader) I see that the Webelos attend Webelos Camporees (day events).

Awards:

- (Den Leaders) I submit my awards requirement in time for the awards to be presented at the Pack Meeting.
- (Committee Chair) I see that one of my committee members tracks awards and gets the awards and prepares the awards for the pack meeting.
- (Committee Chair) I watch for boys who are not advancing and get them, their parents, and Den Leaders help.
- (Committee Chair) I coordinate with the 11-year old Scout leader, the Cubmaster, and the Webelos Den Leader for Webelos Crossing Over Ceremonies.
- (Primary Counselor for Cub Scouts) I see that parents and Cub Scout Leaders are aware of the 8 requirements for the Cub Scout Religious Square Knot as found in the *Faith in God Booklet for Boys*. I see that the boys who finish these requirements are awarded the Cub Scout Religious Square Knot.
- (Primary Counselor for Cub Scouts) I see that Adult Leaders who complete basic training and serve 3 years in Primary Cub Scouts (prior time in Aaronic Priesthood Scouts counts) are awarded the "On My Honor" award.

(Note: Items listed for the Committee Chair can in many cases be delegated to committee members.)
